Join Alison Woollard for this fascinating tour of Paternoster Square which reveals how the area has developed over the centuries in response to the changing needs of Londoners.

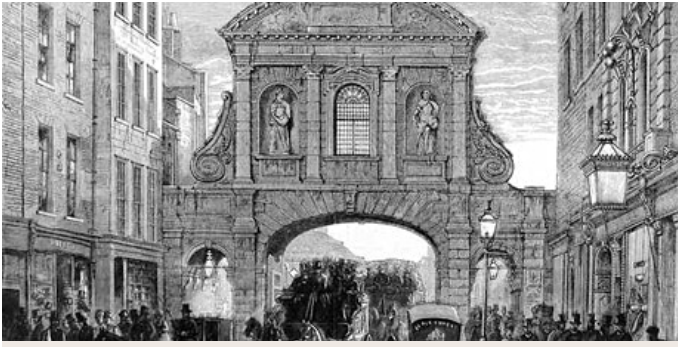
The Square is very recent but what went before? How do we decide what Londoners need now? How might the City change in the future?
